Reflection: 1st December 2024 First Sunday of Advent

When we wish someone a "Happy New Year", we are expressing a hope for good things in the future, and rightly so. On this first Sunday in our year of Christian faith, we see our Bible readings looking forward. Paul is looking forward to seeing his friends in Thessalonica again, so thankful that their new-found faith is alive and well, and praying that their love for the Lord and each other will be strong and growing. Jeremiah is looking forward to someone who will be a replacement for King David, a leader who will bring the people back to righteousness, peace, and faith in God. Jesus is looking to the future as well, but with a stark realism. He warns that there will be very disturbing events caused by upheavals in the natural world. For us, who are becoming increasingly familiar with predictions of the results of change in the climate, the words of Jesus are very sobering. 'Look around at the signs of obvious change', Jesus is saying, 'And be warned'. But Jesus is also saying two other things. First, he is saying 'look to your faith'. In all the turmoil and sufferings that people will always experience, one thing is certain: truth -"Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away". And the second thing Jesus is saying is, 'Be careful how you live'. He warns against "dissipation, drunkenness and the worries of this life." There could hardly be a more timely message for our generation today, not least as our community prepares to celebrate 'Yuletide' with what sometimes cannot be disguised as over-indulgence and extravagance. It does not help to be scrooge-like, but it is important for all of us step back and remember what it is that we are celebrating at Christmas, and what this special time of looking forward in Advent will help us achieve: hopefully, a Happy New Year!

McCabe Educational Trust concerning the needs of the AL SHUROOQ Christian-run school for blind children in Bethlehem.

The school currently has 34 pupils aged 3 – 12 years. 21 pupils who come from Hebron, Jericho and remote parts of the West Bank, live and stay at the school all week as transportation is no longer available to take them home for weekends. Pupils from around Bethlehem commute every day as it is difficult for the school to provide for them to live in-house. This year the school started taking on social cases of children with visual disabilities and opened a new class for 10 pupils with multiple disabilities and behavioral problems. There are plans to bring blind children from Gaza to the school. 24 teachers are currently employed, in addition to therapists who work with special cases.

The school is facing an existential financial crisis with an annual deficit of £140,000. Half of the £1050 raised on Saturday 9th November at the Coffee Morning at Billesdon will be sent to Al Shurooq.

Living Love and faith



A new video and leaflet have been published, providing information and updates on the Living in Love and Faith (LLF) process.

Following the decision at July General Synod to develop proposals to introduce standalone services including Prayers of Love and Faith (PLF) alongside pastoral reassurance, there will be continued input from four working groups into this process.

The new information outlines that between February and July 2025, diocesan synods will be expected to consult on the developments around the prayer implementation, pastoral oversight and guidelines for vocations with regards to new entrants.

As the lead Bishop for the LLF process, Bishop Martyn features in the video.

He said: "I am deeply thankful to all the members of the working groups, for their continued support in this process. This work is costly to many, both in terms of the time and energy it takes, but also because of the personal impact it can have. I hope and pray their work will continue to be fruitful, helping us build relationships, bringing a variety of perspectives, and further advance the work on PLF."

Diocesan Synod November 2024: Bishop Martyn's Presidential Address



A meeting of the Diocesan Synod took place on Saturday 23 November 2024 at Emmanuel Church in Loughborough.

The gathering opened with intercultural worship which included the commissioning of Sophie Holder as Diocesan Director of Racial Equity.

Bishop Martyn's Presidential Address was centred around the Makin Review, in which he spoke about the Church with deep regret, introspection, and a call to action for better safeguarding practices and support for survivors.

Bishops' Lent Appeal 2025

The bishops have chosen to support The Leprosy Mission as their Lent Appeal charity for 2025.

Every two minutes, someone is diagnosed with leprosy. That's more than 200,000 new cases a year. Although it is curable, millions of people worldwide are living with the effects of the disease, from physical disability to mental health problems, poverty and discrimination.

The Leprosy Mission is a global Christian organisation leading the fight against leprosy. Following Jesus Christ, they seek to bring about transformation, breaking the chains of leprosy and empowering people to attain healing, dignity and life in all its fullness.

Everything the charity does is focused on its goals of zero leprosy transmission, zero leprosy disability and zero leprosy discrimination. They work in four key areas to achieve this – diagnosing and treating leprosy; caring for disabled people; fighting stigma; and advocating for change and pioneering research.

The Leprosy Mission runs projects in countries across Africa and Asia, including Nepal, Bangladesh, Ethiopia, Sudan, Nigeria, Niger, Myanmar, Mozambique and Sri Lanka.
