Reflection: Sunday 19th January 2025 Second Sunday of Epiphany The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The Week, January 18-25, is a time for all Christians to come together to pray for greater unity among the Christian denominations. It's a time to ponder both historical and present-day divisions, and to seek God's guidance for healing and reconciliation.

It's a time to recognise the diversity within Christianity, the variety of traditions, cultures, languages and theological views. Division frequently leads to tension, but this week of prayer calls us to look beyond our differences to see the richness of God's work in the different expressions of the Christian faith and to remember that we are united in Christ.

At times Christians have been divisive, judgmental, or have forgotten Christ's love. This week is a time to ask God to heal broken relationship between denominations and also between individuals within the Church.

Unity doesn't mean uniformity. It involves listening to one another, understanding the beliefs and practices of other traditions, and valuing these differences. It's a time to get together, deepen our sense of community and build bridges rather than walls.

Disunity weakens our witness to Christ in the world; however by working together we become stronger as we demonstrate love, peace, and justice - God's kingdom at work.

Central to this Week is prayer. Prayer unites us not only with one another but also with God, for we need his guidance and grace to achieve unity and mutual understanding.

Working towards unity is ongoing but Hope is one of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. We pray for the day when 'there will be one flock, one shepherd' (John 10:16). This hope encourages us in our efforts to achieve God's ultimate plan for His people.

Unity is not an end in itself but a way in which we can glorify God and advance his kingdom on earth, step by step. Hilary Painter

Bible Readings: Sunday 19th January 2025 Second Sunday of Epiphany

Isaiah 62.1-5

1 For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not rest, until her vindication shines out like the dawn,

and her salvation like a burning torch.

2 The nations shall see your vindication,

and all the kings your glory; and you shall be called by a new name

that the mouth of the Lord will give.

3 You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the Lord,

and a royal diadem in the hand of your God.

4 You shall no more be termed Forsaken,

and your land shall no more be termed Desolate; but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the Lord delights in you,

and your land shall be married.

5 For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your builder marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride,

so shall your God rejoice over you.

1 Corinthians 12.1-11

1 Now concerning spiritual gifts, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed.

2 You know that when you were pagans, you were enticed and led astray to idols that could not speak.

3 Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says 'Let Jesus be cursed!' and no one can say 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit.

4 Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; 5 and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; 6 and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone.

7 To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

8 To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit,

9 to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit,

10 to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues.

11 All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses.

John 2.1-11

 On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there.
 Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. 3 When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.'

4 And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.'

5 His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.'

6 Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons.

7 Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim.

8 He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it.

9 When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom

10 and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.'

11 Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
