Reflection: Sunday 13th July 2025 Fourth Sunday after Trinity

Luke 10: 25-37

Who is my neighbour? A question that in various forms has reverted down through time. "Am I my brothers' keeper?" Cain asks of God, having just murdered Abel in the first few chapters of Genisis. Cain was arguing he had no duty towards his brother, but God told Cain in very straight language that he was his brother's keeper. This week as Parliament has discussed what should be the response of the state towards those in our society who are sick and need financial support to remain independent and live a fuller life, this question has been brought into sharp focus. Jesus answers this question with a case study. A man was attacked on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho and left for dead. Lying there the man saw a priest, but rather than help the priest passed by on the other side no doubt to retain or maintain his ritual purity through not touching a corpse. Likewise, a Levite (a worker at the temple) also passed by. Religious men from whom the victim might have expected help as a fellow Jews. But then a Samaritan, a hated heretic, passes by and saves the man. How horrendous this must have sounded to the Jewish hearers that day. My neighbour is literally everyone regardless, with no qualifications and no exceptions. Jesus ends the passage by issuing a challenge, 'go and do likewise'.

Bible Readings: Sunday 13th July Fourth Sunday after Trinity

Deuteronomy 30.9-14

9 and the Lord your God will make you abundantly prosperous in all your undertakings, in the fruit of your body, in the fruit of your livestock, and in the fruit of your soil. For the Lord will again take delight in prospering you, just as he delighted in prospering your ancestors,

10 when you obey the Lord your God by observing his commandments and decrees that are written in this book of the law, because you turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

11 Surely, this commandment that I am commanding you today is not too hard for you, nor is it too far away.
12 It is not in heaven, that you should say, 'Who will go up to heaven for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?'

13 Neither is it beyond the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross to the other side of the sea for us, and get it for us so that we may hear it and observe it?'
14 No, the word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart for you to observe.

Colossians 1.1-14

1 Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,

2 To the saints and faithful brothers and sisters in Christ in Colossae: Grace to you and peace from God our Father.

3 In our prayers for you we always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

4 for we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love that you have for all the saints,

5 because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel

6 that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God.

7 This you learned from Epaphras, our beloved fellowservant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf, 8 and he has made known to us your love in the Spirit.

9 For this reason, since the day we heard it, we have not ceased praying for you and asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding,

10 so that you may lead lives worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing to him, as you bear fruit in every good work and as you grow in the knowledge of God.

11 May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully

12 giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light.

13 He has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, 14 in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Luke 10.25-37

25 Just then a lawyer stood up to test Jesus. 'Teacher,' he said, 'what must I do to inherit eternal life?'
26 He said to him, 'What is written in the law? What do

you read there?'

27 He answered, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your strength, and with all your mind; and your neighbour as yourself.'

28 And he said to him, 'You have given the right answer; do this, and you will live.'

29 But wanting to justify himself, he asked Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?'

30 Jesus replied, 'A man was going down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell into the hands of robbers, who stripped him, beat him, and went away, leaving him half dead.

31 Now by chance a priest was going down that road; and when he saw him, he passed by on the other side.
32 So likewise a Levite, when he came to the place and

saw him, passed by on the other side.

33 But a Samaritan while travelling came near him; and when he saw him, he was moved with pity.

34 He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him.

35 The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, "Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend." 36 Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbour to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?'

37 He said, 'The one who showed him mercy.' Jesus said to him, 'Go and do likewise.'

Our Churches continue to support local Foodbanks. Jubilee Foodbank Market Harborough You can drop off donations at Hallaton Church or to Linda Jones at 25, Eastgate, Hallaton at any time. Please note that all food collected is non-perishable, long-life or tinned.

The Foodbank has **MOST URGENT NEED of:**

Chicken in sauce, Pasta sauce, UHT milk (whole or semiskimmed), Tinned fruit, Tinned pasta

They also need:

Fray Bentos pies, Crackers, Sandwich paste, Tinned ham, Tinned red meat, such as mince, Bolognese, stew, chilli, and hot dogs, Sweets, snacks and crisps Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned carrots, Tinned peas, Tinned tomatoes, Biscuits, Dried potatoes (Smash), Corned beef, Teabags, Cup of Soup, Tinned potatoes, Sugar (500g), John West rice meals, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf not fridge), Sponge puddings, Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

Licensing Launde with God's Love





The licensing of the Revd Crystal McAllister, as Interim Oversight Minister in the Launde Deanery Minster Community, was held during morning prayer on Tuesday 1 July at Bishop's Lodge.

Revd Crystal was surrounded by family, friends, diocesan colleagues and those who have journeyed with her, prayed for her, and championed her along the way.

The service marked the beginning of this three-month role, which sees Revd Crystal move across the diocese from her Ordained Pioneer Minister position in the Framland Deanery.

Talking about this new challenge, and her calling to the role, Revd Crystal said: "I am really excited about the opportunity to lead Launde Minster Community over this interim period...

"My hopes and plans would be a radical outpouring of God's love for people and the parishes in the Minster Community that is transformative," she explains.

"Three months is a short time; however, time isn't a concern for God! I pray that God gives me eyes to draw people's attention to the importance of stillness and listening, to ask what the Spirit is calling God's people to do today, to explore, enable and equip communities to be communities of hope for current and future generations. I plan to visit parishes, break bread, walk, pray, and encourage others to join me in doing so, too."
