### Reflection for Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2024 Eighth Sunday After Trinity

Do you find time is passing faster? Modern inventions were created to give us more time, yet cause us to have less and less; the hours I've spent recently because of the computer operating system upgrade designed to give me a 'better experience'!

The apostles in Sunday's Gospel reading had just returned from their first mission trip. They were excited and ready to do more to build on their success. However, Jesus responded to their enthusiasm with this invitation: 'come away to a deserted place by yourselves and rest a while.'

Jesus knew that rest was the most important thing that his disciples could do at this time. They had done important work, but now it was time to rest. Not just physical rest but spiritual rest too.

That was what Jesus did too. Regularly he went out to a deserted place and there he prayed. Spiritual rest for his soul.

Are we getting enough rest, physical and spiritual? In this fast-paced world we often forget both of these. Studies that show that 7-9 hours of sleep a night is important for most of us, but many are not getting that and it affects our physical health.

But what about spiritual rest, when we don't get enough rest for our minds and souls? It's similar to what happens when we don't get enough sleep. Our spiritual selves become vulnerable to dis-ease. We become frustrated, burned out and depression can set in, even if we are doing good things. Life becomes a downward spiral with no time given to reflect and be grateful.

Jesus encouraged his disciples to get away and rest a while after they returned from their mission trip. This week try to follow the advice of Jesus. Make time to rest; time to do nothing, time to reflect and to listen to God's sweet voice of calm.

### Bible Readings: Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> July 2024 Eighth Sunday After Trinity

#### Jeremiah 23.1-6

### **New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised**

- 1 Woe to the shepherds who destroy and scatter the sheep of my pasture! says the Lord.
- 2 Therefore, thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, concerning the shepherds who shepherd my people: It is you who have scattered my flock, and have driven them away, and you have not attended to them. So I will attend to you for your evil doings, says the Lord.
- 3 Then I myself will gather the remnant of my flock out of all the lands where I have driven them, and I will bring them back to their fold, and they shall be fruitful and multiply.
- 4 I will raise up shepherds over them who will shepherd them, and they shall not fear any longer, or be dismayed, nor shall any be missing, says the Lord.
- 5 The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will raise up for David a righteous Branch, and he shall reign as king and deal wisely, and shall execute justice and righteousness in the land.
- 6 In his days Judah will be saved and Israel will live in safety. And this is the name by which he will be called: 'The Lord is our righteousness.'

### **Ephesians 2.11-end**

### **New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised**

- 11 So then, remember that at one time you Gentiles by birth, called 'the uncircumcision' by those who are called 'the circumcision'-a physical circumcision made in the flesh by human hands-
- 12 remember that you were at that time without Christ, being aliens from the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers to the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world.
- 13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ.
- 14 For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both groups into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us.
- 15 He has abolished the law with its commandments and ordinances, so that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, 16 and might reconcile both groups to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it.
- 17 So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near;
- 18 for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father.
- 19 So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God,
- 20 built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone.

- 21 In him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord;
- 22 in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling-place for God.

### Mark 6.30-34, 53-end

### **New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised**

- 30 The apostles gathered around Jesus, and told him all that they had done and taught.
- 31 He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat.
- 32 And they went away in the boat to a deserted place by themselves.
- 33 Now many saw them going and recognized them, and they hurried there on foot from all the towns and arrived ahead of them.
- 34 As he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.
- 53 When they had crossed over, they came to land at Gennesaret and moored the boat.
- 54 When they got out of the boat, people at once recognized him,
- 55 and rushed about that whole region and began to bring the sick on mats to wherever they heard he was. 56 And wherever he went, into villages or cities or farms, they laid the sick in the market-places, and begged him that they might touch even the fringe of his cloak; and all who touched it were healed.

in the calendar when we, as Christians, are invited to celebrate and learn more about the heritage of people with roots in South Asia, including the counties of India, Pakistan, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Nepal, Bhutan, and the Maldives.

As a diocese, we are made up of many people from a diverse range of geographic, cultural, religious, and ethnic backgrounds.

Jessie Tang, Intercultural Ministry Director in the Diocese of Leicester, says: "In Leicester, one of the largest minority ethnic groups are from South Asia, with a number of our worshipping communities and churches made up of people from these groups. Regardless of the diversity of your community, marking a month like this helps us to recognise the global nature of our faith, and pray for diaspora groups."

Spiritual direction is the practice of being with people as they attempt to deepen their relationship with God, a prayerful ministry by which one Christian accompanies another as they discern the place and work of God in their life.

Holy Listening is a Launde Abbey training course which will help you develop skills and reflective practice for this ministry. You'll explore core aspects of Christian spirituality, and how we create and hold spaces that enable other people to hear God speaking in their lives.

Launde Abbey is seeking interested applicants to form its cohort for 2025 and 2026. Applications must be submitted by Friday 27 September, with interviews to be held on 14 & 16 October.
