Reflection: Sunday 12th January 2025

First Sunday of Epiphany, Baptism of Christ

The Baptism of Jesus

One of the names we give to Jesus, our Saviour, is Emmanuel, God with us. This is because he came to earth to live as one of us. His baptism by John the Baptist is a great example of this. Jesus, along with many other people - all of whom were in need of having their sins washed away in the waters of baptism - submitted to being baptised by John, even though we are told he had no sin within him. This is the occasion when the people present heard the voice of God declaring that Jesus was indeed the Messiah, (not John as some were thinking). Then the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove descends upon Jesus, an early example of our three person God.

In our reading from Acts we are told of Peter and John baptizing Simon and his household. Peter has been commanded by God to do this and at first questions this command because Simon is a Gentile not a Jew. Peter like many others believed that the promise of the Messiah was made only to the Jewish people. Peter had no doubt that Jesus was the Messiah and seems to have forgotten that Jesus's teaching makes it clear that he had come to save all people - that one day every knee would bow to him and every tongue confess that Jesus is Lord of Lords and King of Kings. Of course, it is St Paul who is initially chosen to be the apostle to bring Gentiles to know and worship Jesus, but very early in the history of our faith many Gentiles are drawn into the Church and play a vital role in spreading the Gospel, the Good News for all people.

This is something we are really grateful for. We too can be baptised into the family of Jesus Christ. We too can receive the blessing of the Holy Spirit at our baptism and we too can have all the blessings and promises which Jesus gives to those who accept him as their Saviour, their Lord and King. We have just celebrated Jesus's

coming into our world 2000 years ago, but there is so much more for us to celebrate, most importantly that because he allowed himself to be crucified for our sins and then was resurrected on Easter Day and later ascended back to God, his Father, there is a certain way for us to join with him one day, sins washed away by baptism, and having lived with the Holy Spirit within us, we will spend eternity with our loving and gracious Saviour, our Lord and King, Jesus Christ, our Emmanuel.

Bible Readings: Sunday 12th January 2025 First Sunday of Epiphany, Baptism of Christ

Isaiah 43.1-7

43 But now thus says the Lord,
he who created you, O Jacob,
he who formed you, O Israel: Do not fear, for I have redeemed you;
I have called you by name, you are mine.
2 When you pass through the waters, I will be with you;
and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you;
when you walk through fire you shall not be burned,
and the flame shall not consume you.
3 For I am the Lord your God,
the Holy One of Israel, your Saviour. I give Egypt as your ransom,
Ethiopia and Seba in exchange for you.
4 Because you are precious in my sight,
and honoured, and I love you, I give people in return for you,
nations in exchange for your life.
5 Do not fear, for I am with you;
I will bring your offspring from the east,
and from the west I will gather you;
6 I will say to the north, 'Give them up',
and to the south, 'Do not withhold; bring my sons from far away
and my daughters from the end of the earth-'
7 everyone who is called by my name,
whom I created for my glory,
whom I formed and made.'

Acts 8.14-17

14 Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them.
15 The two went down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit
16 (for as yet the Spirit had not come upon any of them; they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus).
17 Then Peter and John laid their hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Luke 3.15-17, 21-22

15 As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah,
16 John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.
17 His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'
21 Now when all the people were baptized, and when Jesus also had been baptized and was praying, the heaven was opened,
22 and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.'

Focal Ministry is the name being given to this emerging form of ministry, which involves enabling prayer and worship, encouraging others in deepening their faith and equipping local churches to bless their communities.

The role of a Focal Minister is to offer spiritual leadership to a local church or benefice.

Liz Rawlings, our Discipleship and Vocations Enabler, has been reflecting on what she has been noticing, and explains: "As I have travelled around the diocese, I have met a number of people offering local leadership in their churches, enabling prayer and worship, building faith in others and connecting the church with the community.

"It seems that God is at work growing local spiritual leaders and it's inspiring to hear their stories. Our task now is to serve and support this ministry and share what the Spirit is doing among us."
