Reflection: 10th November 2024

Third Sunday before Lent Remembrance Sunday

Jesus has just come from his time of retreat in the wilderness, having resisted temptations from Satan to take the easy way out. He is told of the imprisonment of John the Baptist and knows that it is the time to announce who He is and the purpose of his mission on earth. His first task is to gather a group of disciples together and he does this by calling, not academics or intellectual as other rabbis would have done, but some fairly ordinary fishermen he came across. These men, Mark tells us, immediately leave what they are doing and obey his command to follow him. This account should both encourage us and challenge us. It's good to know that Jesus calls ordinary people like us to serve him but challenging to know that the fishermen respond so quickly to his call. When we feel that God is calling us to serve him in a certain way it is not always easy to respond immediately. Most of us will be hesitant and ask if it is really God calling us and we will need time to explore the possibility more deeply. There is nothing wrong with that but our exploration must involve much prayer and not necessarily just our own. It is a good idea to ask other people to pray about it too - perhaps a few trusted friends who can help us seek God's will for us and how we can help in the situation we feel we are being called to. One of the difficulties of being in such a situation is that we can feel that we are not good enough. Maybe Jesus wants someone with more faith or religious knowledge, but here in this account it is made very clear that Jesus knows who he is calling and all that follows in the Gospels and later in the accounts of the early church tells us that, apart from Judas, who sadly went astray, that band of disciples became a strong and faithful group who gave much, including their own lives, to continue Jesus' ministry on earth and build up the church to which we all belong. May we be encouraged and inspired by this and help each other to respond to whatever calling Jesus makes upon us, knowing that

however challenging it may seem he will be there with us and we will be able to rely on the prayers and help of each other.

Jonah 3.1-5, 10

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 3 The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying,
- 2 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.'
- 3 So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across.
- 4 Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!'
- 5 And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.
- 10 When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

Hebrews 9.24-end

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 24 For Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf.
- 25 Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own;
- 26 for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself.
- 27 And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgement,
- 28 so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Mark 1.14-20

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

14 Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, 15 and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

- 16 As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake-for they were fishermen.
- 17 And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.'
- 18 And immediately they left their nets and followed him.
- 19 As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets.
- 20 Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.




Churches Across the Diocese Encouraged to Mark Safeguarding Sunday
