'I don't care if it is true, I just want to know if it works...' 'You can only buy your way out of trouble for so long ... ' 'Trouble is in a multi-choice world, how do you know what the best choices are for your family ... ' 'I don't believe in anything, but I want my children to believe in something...' 'We're all looking for something, some sense of purpose, or value...'

These are all conversations that I have had over recent years with other parents, none of whom are part of any church and many of whom would describe themselves as spiritual but not religious. How would you describe yourself, or your household?

More than 53% of the British public in the UK describe themselves as having 'no religion,' up from 48% in 2015 and 30% in 1983, according to the annual British Social Attitudes Survey. Those who would consider themselves Anglican number just 15% of the British population and these are those who self define, rather than consider themselves as an active member of any church.

However, the statements above seem to point to something that lies at the core of all religion. The word religion shares its root with the word ligament, the binding of muscle to bone. Each one of us has values, practices, beliefs and behaviours that bind us together, holds life, gives direction, identity and purpose. Everyone is religious in some way. Everyone.

In the past few years, the pandemic, the awareness of climate change and our part in it, global instability, war, political upheaval and economic uncertainty (among other things), have contributed to a growing sense of dis-ease for many. Perhaps that which has held our lives together is suddenly not as secure, rooted, or good as we once hoped.

I wonder, whether your 'religion' is enough or do you seek a deeper and richer narrative to live by? If so, why not get in touch.
