Reflection: 17th November 2024 Second Sunday before Advent

The Christmas advertising campaigns have started, a reminder that Advent is nearly upon us. There are cards to write, presents to choose, entertaining and catering decisions, all to be fitted around our usual activities. However, help is at hand. Spending a little time reflecting on the meaning of Advent, can deepen our connection to its purpose and help us to prepare ourselves spiritually for the arrival of Jesus. It can also help us to decide what's important and what's just media hype and fear of missing out.

Advent is a season of preparation, waiting, and hope. The beginning of the Christian year, it culminates in the celebration of the birth of Christ. Reflecting on Advent can be a deeply spiritual experience, as it invites us to anticipate both Christ's first coming as a baby in Bethlehem and His second coming in glory.

Hope: Advent is a time to cultivate hope, both in the anticipation of Christ's birth and His return. The Old Testament prophets spoke of a coming Saviour, and in Advent, we are reminded of the fulfilment of that hope. Also, our thoughts turning to...

Peace: The angels brought a message of peace to the shepherds and today, as much as ever, we pray for peace, particularly in the Biblical lands and peace in our own lives.

Joy: Advent is a time of joyful anticipation. Even as we wait in the winter darkness, we look forward to the great joy that Christmas can bring.

Love: the ultimate expression of God's love was that he sent His Son into the world. Advent is a time to reflect on God's love for humanity and how we are called to pass on that love.

Preparation: the season of Advent is all about preparing, both for the celebration of Christ's birth and for His second coming. It's a time for us to reflect and make space for God in our lives.

Daniel 12.1-3

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 1 'At that time Michael, the great prince, the protector of your people, shall arise. There shall be a time of anguish, such as has never occurred since nations first came into existence. But at that time your people shall be delivered, everyone who is found written in the book.
- 2 Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake, some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt.
- 3 Those who are wise shall shine like the brightness of the sky, and those who lead many to righteousness, like the stars for ever and ever.

Hebrews 10.11-14 15-18 19-25

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 11 And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins.
- 12 But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God',
- 13 and since then has been waiting 'until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet.'
- 14 For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified.[
- 15 And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying,
- 16 'This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord: I will put my laws in their hearts,
 - and I will write them on their minds',
- 17 he also adds, 'I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more.'
- 18 Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.]
- 19 Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus,
- 20 by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh),
- 21 and since we have a great priest over the house of God,
- 22 let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water.
- 23 Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. 24 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds,
- 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

Mark 13.1-8

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 13 As he came out of the temple, one of his disciples said to him, 'Look, Teacher, what large stones and what large buildings!'
- 2 Then Jesus asked him, 'Do you see these great buildings? Not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.'
- 3 When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives opposite the temple, Peter, James, John, and Andrew asked him privately,
- 4 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign that all these things are about to be accomplished?'
- 5 Then Jesus began to say to them, 'Beware that no one leads you astray.
- 6 Many will come in my name and say, "I am he!" and they will lead many astray.
- 7 When you hear of wars and rumours of wars, do not be alarmed; this must take place, but the end is still to come.
- 8 For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs.

Stamps for your Christmas Cards

Buy your stamps from the Church Association of Sudan and South Sudan (CASSS) The war in Sudan has been described as 'The

Forgotten War'. Did you know that:

- * Half of Sudan's population more than 24.8 million people, almost 13.6 million of whom are children are in need of urgent assistance.
- * Sudan now has the world's largest number of internally displaced people, with more than 11 million people uprooted by the conflict which began in April 2023 2 million more have left Sudan in search of safety.

The churches in Sudan and South Sudan are in a desperate situation and are providing humanitarian aid in the most desperate of situations.

By buying new stamps through the CASSS you can help this situation without costing you any more because CASSS is a registered charity and buys the stamps legally through a stamp dealer at less than face value. This allows CASSS to sell the stamps at normal prices and the difference in prices raises funds for the CASSS.

Stamps are available in all denominations.

The Bishop of Leicester and the Bishop of Loughborough are pleased to announce the appointment of Sophie Holder as Director of Racial Equity for the Diocese of Leicester.

Bishop Martyn said: "I am delighted that Sophie has agreed to take on this key role in the diocese. Sophie brings a wealth of experience in equality, diversity, inclusion and most significantly, racial equity, and will take the lead in forging ahead with this important work in the diocese. I look forward to welcoming her."

"I am passionate about creating a culture of inclusion and belonging and, as Director of Racial Equity for the Diocese of Leicester, will ensure that community, compassion and equity — as exemplified by Christ — is at the heart of my work," said Sophie. "...Building and achieving racial equity will be a journey, one that will take time, change, wisdom and faith. There will be triumphs and challenges, but I believe if we stay the course, God will transform our diocese into a place that welcomes, serves, and introduces all to Christ."

Sophie will be commissioned to her new role at Diocesan Synod on Saturday 23 November 2024 and will begin work on Friday 6 December 2024.

The role of Diocesan Director of Racial Equity has been made possible by national church Racial Justice funding and has been offered on an initial three-year term, by approval of our Bishops' Council and Diocesan Synod.

A diocesan campaign to raise enough money to provide durable, long-lasting seating in Kiteto Cathedral, is appealing to churches to donate the price of one bench.

The Dioceses of Leicester and Kiteto in Tanzania have been linked since 1982. We, as a diocese, partner with Kiteto to support the area in improving education, training pastors, planting churches and by offering financial support for emergencies arising from natural causes.
