

Peace on Earth

As I write, we have just moved from the season of Remembrance and now are looking ahead and planning for Christmas. Some of the words of my reflection for Remembrance Sunday are still clear in my mind and help me move on from one season to the other. Whilst remembering involves looking back at those who have given their lives in war and conflicts past and present, it also inspires us to look forward in the hope and desire of peace throughout the world. By now you may have spotted the word that goes with me as I journey from one season to the next. Peace. I recall the words from the Bible book of Isaiah: Unto us a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

I am then reminded of the words of a favourite Carol: O morning stars, together Proclaim the holy birth, And praises sing to God the King, And peace to all on earth.

You may recall the words are from the Christmas Carol O Little Town of Bethlehem. How poignant it will be to hear the names of the Bible lands in our readings and carols this Christmas. In recent weeks Bethlehem has provided a backdrop to newsreaders as they have reported on the appalling death and destruction in Israel and Palestine. In contrast, the words of the Carol evoke an atmosphere of peace and calm. 'O Little Town of Bethlehem' tries to capture the mystery and meaning of what was happening on that first Christmas. It begins in a specific geographical location but ends in a spiritual place. Bethlehem's streets beneath the stars become our hearts beneath our hopes and fears.

Each Christmas we are reminded: *Where meek souls will receive Him, still the dear Christ enters in.* Christian hope is that peace in our hearts will lead to peace in our streets. I pray that you and your family know the peace of Christ this Christmas and for peacemakers and peacekeepers everywhere.
