## **Reflection: Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> July 2025**

### **Fifth Sunday after Trinity**

#### **Luke 10. 38-end**

In today's gospel, Jesus visits the home of Martha and her sister Mary. Mary finds time to sit and listen to Jesus, but Martha is too busy with her chores and grumbles about the lack of help from her sister.

From one point of view, Mary's position, sitting at Jesus' feet, shows her to be an ideal disciple. She hangs on every word that Jesus utters, putting listening and learning over doing. She has prioritised spiritual learning over housework, much to her sister's disgust.

Martha meanwhile is all action. Hospitality and tidiness for her is a virtue; however, her anxiety and general grumpiness reveal an imbalance. When she appeals to Jesus, he gently tells her that this time Mary has chosen the better part. He doesn't condemn Martha's service, rather he addresses her anxieties. Her problem isn't what she's doing, but what's driving her. Immaculate hospitality shouldn't come before time spent with one's guest.

How easy it is for us to become overcommitted, fretful to have lost our sense of balance. Spiritually we are running on empty. Often it needs someone else to tell us, gently, that the time has come to re-balance our lives.

Like Mary, we need to re-centre our lives on Christ, learning to listen and reflect before doing. Also we can practise leaving the treadmill of our lives for a while to sit at Christ's feet, through reading scripture, prayer and enjoying, for all it's man-made imperfections, God's wonderful world.

As the hymn says:

Teach me my God and King,

In all things Thee to see,

And what I do in anything,

To do it as for Thee.

If you're going on holiday or having a staycation, try to leave work and home worries behind for a while. Find times to sit and think and other times to just sit.

#### **Fifth Sunday after Trinity**

##### **Genesis 18.1-10a**

1 The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day.

2 He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground.

3 He said, 'My lord, if I find favour with you, do not pass by your servant.

4 Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree.

5 Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on-since you have come to your servant.' So they said, 'Do as you have said.'

6 And Abraham hastened into the tent to Sarah, and said, 'Make ready quickly three measures of choice flour, knead it, and make cakes.'

7 Abraham ran to the herd, and took a calf, tender and good, and gave it to the servant, who hastened to prepare it.

8 Then he took curds and milk and the calf that he had prepared, and set it before them; and he stood by them under the tree while they ate.

9 They said to him, 'Where is your wife Sarah?' And he said, 'There, in the tent.'

10 Then one said, 'I will surely return to you in due season, and your wife Sarah shall have a son.' And Sarah was listening at the tent entrance behind him.

##### **Colossians 1.15-28**

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation;

16 for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers-all things have been created through him and for him.

17 He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together.

18 He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything.

19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell,

20 and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

21 And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds,

22 he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him-

23 provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

24 I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church.

25 I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known,

26 the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints.

27 To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory.

28 It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

##### **Luke 10.38-end**

38 Now as they went on their way, he entered a certain village, where a woman named Martha welcomed him into her home.

39 She had a sister named Mary, who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying.

40 But Martha was distracted by her many tasks; so she came to him and asked, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me.'

41 But the Lord answered her, 'Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things;

42 there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her.'

UHT milk (whole or semi-skimmed), Meals that do not need cooking e.g. John West Fish and rice meals, Biscuits, Tinned vegetarian meals e.g. veggie chilli, Sweets, snacks, crisps and cereal bars, Orange squash, Fruit juice, Sugar (500g), Dried potatoes (Smash), Crackers, Tinned sweetcorn, Tinned carrots, Tinned tomatoes, Tinned peas, Tinned ham, Pasta sauce, Tinned red meat, such as mince, Bolognese, stew, chilli,

Fray Bentos pies, Sandwich paste, Tinned fruit, Chicken in sauce, Teabags, Cup of Soup, Tinned potatoes, Sugar (500g), Cup of soup, ALPRO yoghurts (long-life, for the shelf

not fridge), Sponge puddings, Long-life meals, Robinsons minis or similar for families (small squash concentrates), Small cartons of long life milk (for homeless people or someone without a fridge)

## NEW: STOMP Round Leicester



**Leicester Cathedral is on of many city centre locations hosting magnificent elephant sculptures as part of the STOMP Round Leicester art trail, raising vital funds for LOROS Hospice and marking its 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary.**

Forty gentle giants have journeyed into Leicester's streets, parks and open spaces, forming a jumbo trail across the

city until **Sunday 21 September**.

The Cathedral is home to a mini-herd of baby elephant sculptures, adopted and decorated by local schools and community groups.

When the trail ends, the baby elephants will stomp back to join their owners, while the giant elephant sculptures will be auctioned on Wednesday 8 October to raise money for the hospice, which helps terminally ill local people and their families at the most difficult times of their lives.

## Licensing Launde with God's Love



**The licensing of the Revd Crystal McAllister, as Interim Oversight Minister in the Launde Deanery Minster Community, was held during morning prayer on Tuesday 1 July at Bishop's Lodge.**

Revd Crystal was surrounded by family, friends, diocesan colleagues and those who have journeyed with her, prayed for her, and championed her along the way.

The service marked the beginning of this three-month role, which sees Revd Crystal move across the diocese from her Ordained Pioneer Minister position in the Framland Deanery.

Talking about this new challenge, and her calling to the role, Revd Crystal said: "I am really excited about the opportunity to lead Launde Minster Community over this

interim period...

"My hopes and plans would be a radical outpouring of God's love for people and the parishes in the Minster Community that is transformative," she explains.

"Three months is a short time; however, time isn't a concern for God! I pray that God gives me eyes to draw people's attention to the importance of stillness and listening, to ask what the Spirit is calling God's people to do today, to explore, enable and equip communities to be communities of hope for current and future generations. I plan to visit parishes, break bread, walk, pray, and encourage others to join me in doing so, too."


