Reflection: Sunday 1st June 2025 Sunday after Ascension Day Seventh Sunday of Easter

It is a fact of life that we are always preparing for something - a holiday, a diagnosis, the next meal etc. After the Ascension of Jesus, the disciples were told to wait for the Holy Spirit to give them inspiration to begin their mission. Like them today, we pray that same prayer, "Thy Kingdom come...", and we open our hearts and minds to sharing the Pentecost experience of knowing the presence of God in our life as disciples of Jesus.

Paul had a great longing for the Kingdom of God to be a reality in the lives of all whom he met. In Philippi that involved helping the slave girl to find freedom; it involved seeing beyond the pain and frustration of unjust imprisonment; and it led to transforming the life of the jailer and his family. Paul was always prepared for the unexpected.

The first readers of the final verses of the Revelation to St. John were not only hoping that persecution would one day come to an end, but they were preparing for the climax of their faith in the heavenly glory. They were

trying to see beyond their sufferings to the refreshment of the water of life and the glory of heaven as they prayed 'Come, Lord Jesus".

It was Jesus himself, in the Gospel of St. John, who was praying that his disciples would be prepared for the reality of the Kingdom of God through their commitment to a life of love and a striving for unity. In a world which ignores God, that unity which Jesus prays for is first and foremost with God and through a life of sacrificial love with all others of faith.

Whenever we pray the Lord's Prayer, we open our hearts to Jesus telling us to be open to the Pentecost experience and to be ready for the demands of love.

Bible Readings:

Sunday 1st June Sunday after Ascension Day

Seventh Sunday of Easter

Acts 16.16-34

- 16 One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling.
- 17 While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, 'These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation.'
- 18 She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, 'I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her.' And it came out that very hour.
- 19 But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the market-place before the authorities.
- 20 When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, 'These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews
- 21 and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe.'
- 22 The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods.
- 23 After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely.
- 24 Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.
- 25 About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them.
- 26 Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened.
- 27 When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped.

- 28 But Paul shouted in a loud voice, 'Do not harm yourself, for we are all here.'
- 29 The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas.
- 30 Then he brought them outside and said, 'Sirs, what must I do to be saved?'
- 31 They answered, 'Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household.'
- 32 They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house.
- 33 At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay.
- 34 He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

Revelation 22.12-14,16, 17, 20-end

- 12 'See, I am coming soon; my reward is with me, to repay according to everyone's work.
- 13 I am the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last, the beginning and the end.'
- 14 Blessed are those who wash their robes, so that they will have the right to the tree of life and may enter the city by the gates.
- 16 'It is I, Jesus, who sent my angel to you with this testimony for the churches. I am the root and the descendant of David, the bright morning star.'
- 17 The Spirit and the bride say, 'Come.' And let everyone who hears say, 'Come.' And let everyone who is thirsty come. Let anyone who wishes take the water of life as a gift.
- 20 The one who testifies to these things says, 'Surely I am coming soon.' Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!
- 21 The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all the saints.

John 17.20-end

- 20 'I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word,
- 21 that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me.
- 22 The glory that you have given me I have given them, so that they may be one, as we are one,
- 23 I in them and you in me, that they may become completely one, so that the world may know that you have sent me and have loved them even as you have loved me.
- 24 Father, I desire that those also, whom you have given me, may be with me where I am, to see my glory, which you have given me because you loved me before the foundation of the world.
- 25 'Righteous Father, the world does not know you, but I know you; and these know that you have sent me.
- 26 I made your name known to them, and I will make it known, so that the love with which you have loved me may be in them, and I in them.'



Caring for God's Precious Gift of Creation



Has your church filled in the Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) yet?

The Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) is an easy-to-use online tool that will reveal your church's carbon footprint, based on the energy you use to heat and light your buildings. All the information you need to fill in the EFT can be found on your church energy bills and should take less than an hour to complete.

As well as being of use at a diocesan level, data collected from the tool will help your church understand its own carbon footprint and could result in savings on energy bills. Churches may also be eligible for grants that will help kickstart their carbon reducing projects as we journey together to reach Net Zero Carbon.

Across the Church of England, Leicester is one of 12 dioceses which have achieved over 30% so far.
