Reflection: Sunday 27th April 2025 Second Sunday of Easter

Doubt is faith in two minds said Os Guinness in his book on Doubt written in the 1970s, which I finally managed to get through almost 40 years after I bought it! In our gospel reading today from John's gospel, we meet in Thomas a man who wasn't in two minds at all seemingly. He resolutely did not believe that the risen Jesus had visited the disciples in a locked room. He wanted evidence before he was going to believe what the other disciples who had been there did. Arguably this is not doubt, it is unbelief, which is the opposite of faith. But even in his unbelief Jesus met Thomas. Straightaway Jesus turns to Thomas and throws his own words back at him, Jesus tells Thomas to put his fingers in the nail holes and his hand in Jesus's side and start believing. Thomas moves from unbelief to belief in an instance, declaring Jesus his Lord and God, but Jesus rebukes Thomas by pointing out that he had believed because he had seen, how much better it is for those (like us) who had not seen and yet believed concludes Jesus. To believe in something without the physical proof is faith. To believe that the Easter events we have just celebrated happened, and that as a result the human condition in relation to God changed for ever is the central tenant of the Christian faith. Only Christianity makes the claim that through faith in Jesus we can be put right with God.

In Launde we face considerable doubt, unbelief and lack of interest in our churches, which can often seem to sap our spiritual strength. Easter is a time to ponder on the wonders of God and recharge our batteries ready to be a witness for Jesus again.

Bible Readings:

Sunday 27th April

Second Sunday of Easter

Acts 5.27-32

27 When they had brought them, they had them stand before the council. The high priest questioned them, 28 saying, 'We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name, yet here you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and you are determined to bring this man's blood on us.'

29 But Peter and the apostles answered, 'We must obey God rather than any human authority.

30 The God of our ancestors raised up Jesus, whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree.

31 God exalted him at his right hand as Leader and Saviour, so that he might give repentance to Israel and forgiveness of sins.

32 And we are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.'

Revelation 1.4-8

4 John to the seven churches that are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven spirits who are before his throne,

5 and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn of the dead, and the ruler of the kings of the earth. To him who loves us and freed us from our sins by his blood,

6 and made us to be a kingdom, priests serving his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

7 Look! He is coming with the clouds; every eye will see him, even those who pierced him; and on his account all the tribes of the earth will wail. So it is to be. Amen.

8 'I am the Alpha and the Omega', says the Lord God, who is and who was and who is to come, the Almighty.

John 20.19-end

19 When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.'

20 After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

21 Jesus said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.'

22 When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit.

23 If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained.'

24 But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came.

25 So the other disciples told him, 'We have seen the Lord.' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe.'

26 A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you.'

27 Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe.'

28 Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!'

29 Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.'

30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book.

31 But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.
