Reflection for Sunday 4th February 2024 Second Sunday before Lent

Not long now to Lent! It would be good to look forward to doing something special, perhaps a special book to read, a discussion group, more effort to attend worship, more time for prayer, or other things perhaps as well. Reading, talking, discussing, worshipping, praying — a lot of words. But words are important for words feed our minds and help us to grow spiritually. Words are important in the Old Testament. God spoke the Word and the creation came into being, and the prophets told people, "Hear the Word of the Lord". Words also speak wisdom, and in our Proverbs reading Wisdom is with God in the act of creation. She raises 'her' voice and is therefore feminine, but Wisdom is also identified with the role of Jesus, the Word, in creation.

But in our Gospel passage we read the familiar Christmas words: "The Word became flesh and lived among us and we have **seen** his glory." In the New Testament people are told not only to listen, but also to see. Nathaniel was told that he would see the angels ascending and descending upon the Son of Man. Most notably, some Greeks came to Philip and Andrew and asked to see Jesus. When Jesus received the message, he replied, "Unless a grain of wheat falls into ground, it remains a single grain...If it dies, it bears much fruit." Jesus is saying to them, 'If you want to see me and know me, follow my way of sacrifice; live my way of life.' Lent can also be a time of fasting and that means being prepared to make certain sacrifices. We pray at each Eucharist that we might be sent out 'as a living sacrifice' and in Lent, as we look more closely at the life of our lord, we may see ways in which we can be more faithful in the sacrificial use of our time, skills and possessions. Perhaps by living sacrificially we can more fully enjoy the gift we were told about at Christmas - the power to become his children. **Revd Philip Norwood**

Proverbs 8.1, 22-31

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 8 1 Does not wisdom call, and does not understanding raise her voice?
- 22 The Lord created me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of long ago.
- 23 Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth.
- 24 When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water.
- 25 Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth-
- 26 when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.
- 27 When he established the heavens, I was there, when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,
- 28 when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep,
- 29 when he assigned to the sea its limit,
- so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth,
- 30 then I was beside him, like a master worker; and I was daily his delight,
 - rejoicing before him always,
- 31 rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the human race.

Colossians 1.15-20

15 He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation;

- 16 for in him all things in heaven and on earth were created, things visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or powers-all things have been created through him and for him.
- 17 He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together.
- 18 He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything.
- 19 For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell,

20 and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

John 1.1-14

New Revised Standard Version, Anglicised

- 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- 2 He was in the beginning with God.

- 3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being
- 4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.
- 6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- 7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.
- 8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.
- 9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.
- 10 He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.
- 11 He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him.
- 12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, 13 who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.
- 14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen


Food Bank Appeal:
