Reflection: Sunday 25th May 2025

Sixth Sunday of Easter

John 14:23-29

The Passage today, is one of the mainly discourses of Jesus that the gospel of John records. The basic tenant of the text is clear, if you love me you will follow my teaching, and if you do not love me you will not follow my teaching. That's the easy bit. The harder non-specific bit of the text is the question of what does following Jesus's teaching entail? While Jesus does not specify an answer here, he does promise the giving to Christians of the Holy Spirit, to help us to understand what Jesus taught. The Holy Spirit is the sign of God's love for us, in helping us to live better and more productive Christian lives. What Jesus then does, is to give the disciples and by association us, His peace. Jesus concludes by returning to a refrain found elsewhere in John's gospel, which is to not be afraid.

Being afraid is a very natural reaction, we are taught that Humans contain within us a 'fight or fly' mentality. Whether it is the problems in the world, the wars in Gaza or Ukraine, or political instability in the USA, the cost-of-living etc, or whether we worry about the future of our churches in Launde, the injunction to not be

afraid, seems to be hollow and perfunctory. Yet that is exactly what Jesus is commanding here. Letting go and giving the world and indeed our churches in Launde over to God, is a remedy for peace. It doesn't mean stopping praying and stopping working for God where we are. It means being at peace that ultimately God's plan will be fulfilled where we are, being assured as John reminds us of the love of the Father.

Bible Readings:
Sunday 25th May
Sixth Sunday of Easter

Acts 16.9-15

9 During the night Paul had a vision: there stood a man of Macedonia pleading with him and saying, 'Come over to Macedonia and help us.'

10 When he had seen the vision, we immediately tried to cross over to Macedonia, being convinced that God had called us to proclaim the good news to them.

11 We set sail from Troas and took a straight course to Samothrace, the following day to Neapolis,

12 and from there to Philippi, which is a leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman colony. We remained in this city for some days.

13 On the sabbath day we went outside the gate by the river, where we supposed there was a place of prayer; and we sat down and spoke to the women who had gathered there.

14 A certain woman named Lydia, a worshipper of God, was listening to us; she was from the city of Thyatira and a dealer in purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to what was said by Paul.

15 When she and her household were baptized, she urged us, saying, 'If you have judged me to be faithful to the Lord, come and stay at my home.' And she prevailed upon us.

Revelation 21.10, 22-22.5

10 And in the spirit he carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God.

22 I saw no temple in the city, for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb.

23 And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

24 The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it.

25 Its gates will never be shut by day-and there will be no night there.

26 People will bring into it the glory and the honour of the nations.

27 But nothing unclean will enter it, nor anyone who practises abomination or falsehood, but only those who are written in the Lamb's book of life.

22 Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb

2 through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

3 Nothing accursed will be found there any more. But the throne of God and of the Lamb will be in it, and his servants will worship him;

4 they will see his face, and his name will be on their foreheads.

5 And there will be no more night; they need no light of lamp or sun, for the Lord God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.

John 14.23-29

23 Jesus answered him, 'Those who love me will keep my word, and my Father will love them, and we will come to them and make our home with them.

24 Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; and the word that you hear is not mine, but is from the Father who sent me.

25 'I have said these things to you while I am still with you.

26 But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you.

27 Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.

28 You heard me say to you, "I am going away, and I am coming to you." If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I.

29 And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe.

Alternative Reading to John 14.23-29:

John 5.1-9

5 After this there was a festival of the Jews, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem.

2 Now in Jerusalem by the Sheep Gate there is a pool, called in Hebrew Beth-zatha, which has five porticoes.

3 In these lay many invalids-blind, lame, and paralysed.

5 One man was there who had been ill for thirty-eight years.

6 When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had been there a long time, he said to him, 'Do you want to be made well?'

7 The sick man answered him, 'Sir, I have no one to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up; and while I am making my way, someone else steps down ahead of me.'

8 Jesus said to him, 'Stand up, take your mat and walk.'

9 At once the man was made well, and he took up his mat and began to walk. Now that day was a sabbath.

Caring for God's Precious Gift of Creation



Has your church filled in the Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) yet?

The Energy Footprint Tool (EFT) is an easy-to-use online tool that will reveal your church's carbon footprint, based on the energy you use to heat and light your buildings. All the information you need to fill in the EFT can be found on your church energy bills and should take less than an hour to complete.

As well as being of use at a diocesan level, data collected from the tool will help your church understand its own carbon footprint and could result in savings on energy bills. Churches may also be eligible for grants that will help kickstart their carbon reducing projects as we journey together to reach Net Zero Carbon.

Across the Church of England, Leicester is one of 12 dioceses which have achieved over 30% so far.
