Reflection: 22nd December 2024 Fourth Sunday of Advent

This Sunday's gospel reading tells of the meeting of two remarkable women - women who trusted in God. Elizabeth, despite her advanced years, has become pregnant, as the angel had announced to her husband, Zechariah, and so, some five or so months later, has her relative, Mary. Having heard the good news about Elizabeth's condition, Mary has lost no time in going to greet her. If she had any lingering doubts about what Gabriel had told her then Elizabeth's greeting, calling her 'the mother of my Lord' and the confirmation of John's response, as yet unborn, should have allayed her fears. Mary has been doubly blest - she is physically the mother of Jesus and spiritually as well. Jesus would later say 'My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it'. Mary has indeed heard the word of God and obeyed. Roman Catholics have no hesitation in using the expression 'Mother of God' to describe Mary, although Protestants are more uncomfortable with the term. The Orthodox churches refer to her as the 'Theotokos', which means 'God -bearer', a linguistically cumbersome but theologically neater way of putting it. She is the one who carries and then gives birth to the infant Jesus. She has a more intimate relationship with him than is possible for any other human being. And to do so she has taken a big risk. The stigma of being an unmarried mother was far greater then than it is now and there was a distinct possibility that her planned marriage to Joseph would not go ahead. Yet she trusted in God that he could and would solve these problems.

Similarly, Elizabeth trusted in God, that he would fulfil his promise, and that mother and baby would come safely through the pregnancy. Remember, infant mortality and the risk to a mother's life were considerably greater in those days. We acclaim Elizabeth in being the first to recognise that Mary carried within her the Saviour of the world.

Here are two remarkable women with an essential part to play in God's purposes for humanity. Both present us with a challenge. Are we, like Mary, prepared to let Jesus into our hearts and lives, no matter what the cost? And are we, like Elizabeth, able to see that same Jesus Christ in one another? This is what today's reading asks of us.

Micah 5.2-5a

2 But you, O Bethlehem of Ephrathah, who are one of the little clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me

(in the scroll of the book it is written of me).'

8 When he said above, 'You have neither desired nor taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt-offerings and sin-offerings' (these are offered according to the law),

9 then he added, 'See, I have come to do your will.' He abolishes the first in order to establish the second.

41 When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit

42 and exclaimed with a loud cry, 'Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb.

43 And why has this happened to me, that the mother of my Lord comes to me?

44 For as soon as I heard the sound of your greeting, the child in my womb leapt for joy.

45 And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfilment of what was spoken to her by the Lord.'[

46 And Mary said, 'My soul magnifies the Lord,

47 and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour,

48 for he has looked with favour on the lowliness of his servant.

Surely, from now on all generations will call me

- 49 for the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is his name.
- 50 His mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation.
- 51 He has shown strength with his arm;

Isaiah 52.7-10

7 How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace, who brings good news,

who announces salvation, who says to Zion, 'Your God reigns.'

- 8 Listen! Your sentinels lift up their voices, together they sing for joy; for in plain sight they see the return of the Lord to Zion.
- 9 Break forth together into singing, you ruins of Jerusalem; for the Lord has comforted his people,

he has redeemed Jerusalem.

10 The Lord has bared his holy arm

before the eyes of all the nations; and all the ends of the earth shall see

the salvation of our God.

Hebrews 1.1-4 5-12

1 Long ago God spoke to our ancestors in many and various ways by the prophets,

2 but in these last days he has spoken to us by a Son, whom he appointed heir of all things, through whom he also created the worlds.

3 He is the reflection of God's glory and the exact imprint of God's very being, and he sustains all things by his powerful word. When he had made purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

4 having become as much superior to angels as the name he has inherited is more excellent than theirs.

5 For to which of the angels did God ever say, 'You are my Son;

today I have begotten you'? Or again, 'I will be his Father.

and he will be my Son'?

with the oil of gladness beyond your companions.'

10 And, 'In the beginning, Lord, you founded the earth, and the heavens are the work of your hands;

11 they will perish, but you remain; they will all wear out like clothing;

12 like a cloak you will roll them up, and like clothing they will be changed. But you are the same,

and your years will never end.'

John 1.1-14

1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

2 He was in the beginning with God.

3 All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being

4 in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.

7 He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him.

8 He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light.

9 The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world.

10 He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.

11 He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him.

12 But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God,

13 who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God.

14 And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

Dear All


