Reflection: Sunday 23rd February 2025 Second Sunday before Lent

Have you felt like giving up lately? A well-known phrase that was also the title of a book by the American Pastor David Wilkinson, famous for his work with American Street Gangs in New York, that spawned a best-selling book and film entitled 'The Cross and the Switchblade'. But it's not the contents of his book that I remember, but the front cover, showing a marathon runner clearly exhausted and shuffling along rather than running but not giving up! How often do we feel like that runner struggling but somehow finding the strength to not give up. Feeling like there is no light at the end of the tunnel but persevering? For millions in this country this is a daily reality, and Christians are not exempt from a feeling of helplessness in the face of illness or financial hardship and fear for the future..

Our readings for Morning prayer on the last Sunday in February from the books of Job and Acts, are about people who chose not to give up. Job, despite the misfortunes, and bewilderment of feeling that God had abandoned him could exclaim "I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth "(Job 19:25 KJV). (If you've started to sing the aria

from Handal's Messiah, your penance is to put an extra pound on the collection plate the next time you go to church). The man crippled from birth in Lystra in the second reading Acts 14:8-17 also had faith to believe despite all the evidence to the contrary having been crippled since birth, that he could be healed. He was right. Faith is seeing past the present to what the future can be and not giving up, as Mother Julian reminds us, 'all will be well'.

Bible Readings:

Sunday 23rd February 2025

Second Sunday before Lent

Genesis 2.4b-9, 15-end

4 These are the generations of the heavens and the earth when they were created. In the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens,

5 when no plant of the field was yet in the earth and no herb of the field had yet sprung up-for the Lord God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was no one to till the ground;

6 but a stream would rise from the earth, and water the whole face of the ground-

7 then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being.

8 And the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the east; and there he put the man whom he had formed.

9 Out of the ground the Lord God made to grow every tree that is pleasant to the sight and good for food, the tree of life also in the midst of the garden, and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil.

15 The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.

16 And the Lord God commanded the man, 'You may freely eat of every tree of the garden;

17 but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat of it you shall die.'

18 Then the Lord God said, 'It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner.'

19 So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called each living creature, that was its name.

20 The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner.

21 So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.

22 And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.

23 Then the man said, 'This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken.'

24 Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

25 And the man and his wife were both naked, and were not ashamed.

Revelation 4

4 After this I looked, and there in heaven a door stood open! And the first voice, which I had heard speaking to me like a trumpet, said, 'Come up here, and I will show you what must take place after this.'

2 At once I was in the spirit, and there in heaven stood a throne, with one seated on the throne!

3 And the one seated there looks like jasper and cornelian, and around the throne is a rainbow that looks like an emerald.

4 Around the throne are twenty-four thrones, and seated on the thrones are twenty-four elders, dressed in white robes, with golden crowns on their heads.

5 Coming from the throne are flashes of lightning, and rumblings and peals of thunder, and in front of the throne burn seven flaming torches, which are the seven spirits of God;

6 and in front of the throne there is something like a sea of glass, like crystal. Around the throne, and on each side of the throne, are four living creatures, full of eyes in front and behind:

7 the first living creature like a lion, the second living creature like an ox, the third living creature with a face like a human face, and the fourth living creature like a flying eagle.

8 And the four living creatures, each of them with six wings, are full of eyes all around and inside. Day and night without ceasing they sing, 'Holy, holy, holy, the Lord God the Almighty, who was and is and is to come.'

9 And whenever the living creatures give glory and honour and thanks to the one who is seated on the throne, who lives for ever and ever,

10 the twenty-four elders fall before the one who is seated on the throne and worship the one who lives for ever and ever; they cast their crowns before the throne, singing,

11 'You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honour and power, for you created all things, and by your will they existed and were created.'

Luke 8.22-25

22 One day he got into a boat with his disciples, and he said to them, 'Let us go across to the other side of the lake.' So they put out,

23 and while they were sailing he fell asleep. A gale swept down on the lake, and the boat was filling with water, and they were in danger.

24 They went to him and woke him up, shouting, 'Master, Master, we are perishing!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and the raging waves; they ceased, and there was a calm.

25 He said to them, 'Where is your faith?' They were afraid and amazed, and said to one another, 'Who then is this, that he commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him?'

Churches Invited to Apply to Newly Expanded £5million Conservation Fund

Parishes are being encouraged to apply for grants towards the conservation of historical and cultural heritage through the Church of England's conservation grants scheme which is supported by £4.68million from The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Applications for grants to fund the conservation of special objects such as stained glass, paintings, bells, organs and clocks in churches are now open.

Grants towards building repairs of up to £25,000 that are linked to the conservation of an object and bids for specialist surveys and help with existing recipients' conservation projects will be considered for funding as well.

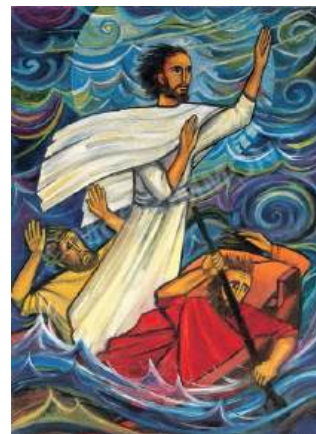
