Reflection: 15th December 2024 Third Sunday of Advent

This week we read of John the Baptist preparing for the joyful news to be brought by Jesus. But what kind of joy?

This is echoed in Philippians 4:4-7, where Paul offers a powerful and caring message of joy and peace that comes by trusting in God, especially in the midst of anxiety.

Paul, despite writing from prison, commands us to rejoice. He's not denying circumstances or pretending that everything is fine, rather it's about finding joy in

God's presence, remembering who God is and what He has done.

He emphasises the word 'always' because joy in the Lord isn't just for the good times.

Paul speaks of gentleness, not as a weakness, but rather strength under control. He tells us: do not be anxious. Instead of letting anxiety rule our hearts, bring every concern, large or small, to God in prayer; an antidote to anxiety.

Finally Paul asks that 'the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.'

The result of choosing joy, gentleness, and prayer is a deep, spiritual peace beyond human understanding. It doesn't necessarily make sense, especially when times are hard, but it's an inner peace that comes from knowing God is in control and that He cares for us deeply.

Paul's words are a comforting and practical guide to dealing with the challenges of life, reminding us that we are called to rejoice because our joy is grounded in who God is and His unshakable promises. Instead of allowing circumstances to dictate our emotions, we are invited to anchor ourselves in the unchanging truth of God's presence and gifts. When we do so, His peace will guard our hearts, enabling us to live with hope and joy, even in uncertain times.

Zephaniah 3.14-end

14 Sing aloud, O daughter Zion; shout, O Israel! Rejoice and exult with all your heart, O daughter Jerusalem!

15 The Lord has taken away the judgements against you,

he has turned away your enemies. The king of Israel, the Lord, is in your midst;

you shall fear disaster no more.

16 On that day it shall be said to Jerusalem: Do not fear, O Zion;

do not let your hands grow weak.

17 The Lord, your God, is in your midst,

a warrior who gives victory; he will rejoice over you with gladness,

he will renew you in his love; he will exult over you with loud singing

as on a day of festival. I will remove disaster from you, so that you will not bear reproach for it.

19 I will deal with all your oppressors at that time. And I will save the lame and gather the outcast, and I will change their shame into praise

and renown in all the earth.

20 At that time I will bring you home,

at the time when I gather you; for I will make you renowned and praised

among all the peoples of the earth, when I restore your fortunes

before your eyes, says the Lord.

Philippians 4.4-7

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. 5 Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near.

6 Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God.

7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Luke 3.7-18

7 John said to the crowds that came out to be baptized by him, 'You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?

8 Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, "We have Abraham as our ancestor"; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham.

9 Even now the axe is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.'

10 And the crowds asked him, 'What then should we do?'

11 In reply he said to them, 'Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do likewise.'

12 Even tax-collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, 'Teacher, what should we do?'

13 He said to them, 'Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you.'

14 Soldiers also asked him, 'And we, what should we do?' He said to them, 'Do not extort money from anyone by threats or false accusation, and be satisfied with your wages.'

15 As the people were filled with expectation, and all were questioning in their hearts concerning John, whether he might be the Messiah,

16 John answered all of them by saying, 'I baptize you with water; but one who is more powerful than I is coming; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

17 His winnowing-fork is in his hand, to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire.'

18 So, with many other exhortations, he proclaimed the good news to the people.

McCabe Educational Trust concerning the needs of the AL SHUROOQ Christian-run school for blind children in Bethlehem.

Is your Church thinking about a Charity to support this Christmas? What about the

The school currently has 34 pupils aged 3-12 years. 21 pupils who come from Hebron, Jericho and remote parts of the West Bank, live and stay at the school all week as transportation is no longer available to take them home for weekends. Pupils from around Bethlehem commute every day as it is difficult for the school to provide for them to live in-house. This year the school started taking on social cases of children with visual disabilities and opened a new class for 10 pupils with multiple disabilities and behavioral problems. There are plans to bring blind children from Gaza to the school. 24 teachers are currently employed, in addition to therapists who work with special cases.

The school is facing an existential financial crisis with an annual deficit of £140,000. Half of the £1050 raised on Saturday 9th November at the Coffee Morning at Billesdon will be sent to Al Shurooq.

Safeguarding in the Launde Deanery/ Minster Community An important letter from Revd Canon Jonathan Dowman and Revd Jayne Lewis:

Dear Churchwardens, PCC Secretaries and Parish Representatives

(and copied to Safeguarding Co-ordinators)

Recent news regarding the resignation of the Archbishop of Canterbury makes this communication very timely and poignant.

At the last two deanery synod meetings we have spoken about our wish to support PCCs to have a working understanding of their responsibilities regarding the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults and to know what good safeguarding should look like in our small rural parishes. Every member of the PCC is a charity trustee and, as such, has responsibilities outlined by the Charity Commission and the Church of England. This was recently reinforced by Bishop Martyn in his presidential address to Diocesan Synod (which can be found at Presidential Address to Diocesan Synod - November 2024 - Diocese of Leicester. (See below) Training pathways have been provided to help us with

All members of the PCC are required to complete the following short safeguarding training courses every 3 years: Basic Awareness, Foundation, & Raising Awareness of Domestic Abuse. These can be completed online through the National Safeguarding team training portal

at <u>safeguardingtraining.cofeportal.org/</u> or in- person if the PCC member would rather.

We would therefore urge you to check with your PCC members to discover the following:

- Are all the members of your PCC up to date with their Safeguarding training? Yes/No
- For those who need to complete or update their training, please answer the following:
- a) PCC members are able to access to the online training portal and will do so independently. Yes/No
 b) PCCs will arrange support for members locally to enable completion of online training. Yes/No
 c) In person training is preferred (see below).

NB. Please keep a record of your PCC members and their training record (see link below to Excel spreadsheet).

We have arranged Basic Awareness training with Louise Warner, Leicester Diocese Safeguarding Training Officer on either Monday 20th, Monday 27th or Thursday 30th January (10.00am-12.30pm) at The Old School, Billesdon. Once we know who needs in-person training, Wendy will make contact to find the date that suits the largest number of people. Ride+Stride and Grants to Churches in 2024

The LeicesterShire Historic Churches Trust is delighted to announce that more than £40,000 has been raised through Ride+Stride, held on 14 September.

Sean Dudley (Ride+Stride Co-ordinator) and Janet Arthur MBE (Chair) of LHCT write:

"We were hoping to break through £40,000 and we've done it! We are very grateful to everyone who registered and opened their church or chapel for Ride+Stride, to everyone who raised funds through riding, striding or welcoming, and to all their sponsors – thank you for a wonderful, collective Ride+Stride effort. Sponsorship moneys are still being received and we will look forward to announcing the final total in January. The Trust's share of the Ride+Stride funds will all be used for grants in 2025.

"The Trust recently held its Autumn Grants Meeting at which grants totalling £22,700 were awarded to seven Anglican churches and one Methodist church. In the Spring, we awarded £29,400 to 11 Anglican churches and one Baptist church. This is a considerable increase in grant applications following (we believe) a lull due to Covid. The total of grants awarded in 2024 is therefore £52,100 raised through Ride+Stride 2023 and grants from the Jack Patston, Edith Murphy, Florence Turner and Maud Elkington charitable trusts, and a generous private donation.

Living Love and faith



A new video and leaflet have been published, providing information and updates on the Living in Love and Faith (LLF) process.

Following the decision at July General Synod to develop proposals to introduce standalone services including Prayers of Love and Faith (PLF) alongside pastoral reassurance, there will be continued input from four working groups into this process.

The new information outlines that between February and July 2025, diocesan synods will be expected to consult on the developments around the prayer implementation, pastoral oversight and guidelines for vocations with regards to new entrants.

As the lead Bishop for the LLF process, Bishop Martyn features in the video.

He said: "I am deeply thankful to all the members of the working groups, for their continued support in this process. This work is costly to many, both in terms of the time and energy it takes, but also because of the personal impact it can have. I hope and pray their work will continue to be fruitful, helping us build relationships, bringing a variety of perspectives, and further advance the work on PLF."

Diocesan Synod November 2024: Bishop Martyn's Presidential Address



A meeting of the Diocesan Synod took place on Saturday 23 November 2024 at Emmanuel Church in Loughborough.

The gathering opened with intercultural worship which included the commissioning of Sophie Holder as Diocesan Director of Racial Equity.

Bishop Martyn's Presidential Address was centred around the Makin Review, in which he spoke about the Church with deep regret, introspection, and a call to action for better safeguarding practices and support for survivors.
